Sunday, January 31 2016

As you read the scripture slowly, notice what word or words about unity catches your attention. Hold onto that word or words and while taking in a deep breath say the word(s). As you release the breath say, "Regardless of anything, may I see myself as one with God and others."

John 17:21-23 *I pray they will be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. I pray that they also will be in us, so that the world will believe that you sent me. I've given them the glory that you gave me so that they can be one just as we are one. I'm in them and you are in me so that they will be made perfectly one. Then the world will know that you sent me and that you have loved them just as you loved me.*

Monday, February 1, 2016

Malachi 2:10 *Are we not all children of the same Father? Are we not all created by the same God? Then why do we betray each other, violating the covenant of our ancestors?*

Galatians 3:26-28 *You are all God's children through faith in Christ Jesus. All of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek; there is neither slave nor free; nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.*

Thursday, February 4, 2016

As you read the scripture slowly, notice what word or words about unity catches your attention. Hold onto that word or words and while taking in a deep breath say the word(s). As you release the breath say, "Regardless of anything, may I see myself as one with God and others."

1 Peter 3:8-9 *Finally, all of you be of one mind, sympathetic, lovers of your fellow believers, compassionate, and modest in your opinion of yourselves. Don't pay back evil for evil or insult for insult. Instead, give blessing in return. You were called to do this so that you might inherit a blessing.*

Friday February 5, 2016

As you read the scripture slowly, notice what word or words about unity catches your attention. Hold onto that word or words and while taking in a deep breath say the word(s). As you release the breath say, "Regardless of anything, may I see myself as one with God and others."

Romans 15:5 *May the God of endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude toward each other, similar to Christ Jesus' attitude.*

Saturday, February 6, 2016

As you read the scripture slowly, notice what word or words about unity catches your attention. Hold onto that word or words and while taking in a deep breath say the word(s). As you release the breath say, "Regardless of anything, may I see myself as one with God and others."

Ephesians 4:2-6 *Conduct yourselves with all humility, gentleness, and patience. Accept each other with love, and make an effort to preserve the unity of the Spirit with the peace that ties you together. You are one body and one spirit, just as God also called you in one hope. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God and Father of all, who is over all, through all, and in all.*
